Interior Color Trends for 2026 from Pantone, BEHR and Sherwin-Williams



As the design world steps into 2026, the message from leading paint and color authorities is unmistakably clear: interiors are shifting toward calm confidence. Spaces are becoming more intentional, more restorative, and more expressive. This year's Colors of the Year from BEHR, Sherwin-Williams, and Pantone each speak to a new era of elevated simplicity and grounded luxury.

A Return to Deep, Grounded Color with BEHR's "Hidden Gem"
 BEHR's 2026 Color of the Year, Hidden Gem (N430-6A), anchors the year's palette with a smoky jade tone that feels equal parts mystery and sophistication.

Designers are already using it as:

- A grounding backdrop for natural textures like oak and stone
- A sophisticated contrast against warm whites and creams
- A hospitality-friendly alternative to charcoal and navy

Hidden Gem is the first hint that 2026 isn't about statement colors. Think elevated lounges, calming reading rooms, and lobbies designed to slow your pulse.

Pantone's "Cloud Dancer": The Rise of the Soft Neutral Reset
 Pantone took a quieter approach for 2026, naming Cloud Dancer (11-4201) as its Color of the Year.

Pantone describes Cloud Dancer as a "blank canvas to create," and that messaging is resonating across workplace, education, and healthcare environments. After years of color saturation and trend cycling, organizations are leaning into palettes that support mental clarity and flexibility.

What Cloud Dancer signals for 2026:

- A push toward restorative environments
- Greater focus on daylight, biophilia, and emotional wellness
- Interiors that feel airy, uncluttered, and future-ready

Cloud Dancer is also the perfect neutral partner to both earthy tones and deep gem shades, making it a connective thread between BEHR's and Sherwin-Williams' picks.

Sherwin-Williams' "Universal Khaki": The Rise of Modern Warmth

Rounding out 2026 is Sherwin-Williams' Universal Khaki (SW 6150), a warm, inviting neutral that signals the shift away from grays and toward nature-based hues. This isn't the khaki of early 2000s rental units. It's richer, more dimensional, and incredibly adaptable.

Universal Khaki supports several major 2026 movements:

- The return of warmth in commercial spaces
- Pairing neutrals with high-contrast textures like black metal and marble
- Layered palettes where soft browns, greens, and off-whites coexist

Designers are using Universal Khaki as a unifying color; as it is strong enough to define a room, subtle enough to let the furniture and art take center stage.

Pantone's Cloud Dancer

Sherwin-Williams' Universal Khaki
